

“Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not: for of such is the kingdom of God.”(Mark 10:14)

Such Is The Kingdom Of God

Almost identical verses, as the one above, can be found in the book of Matthew, chapter 19;

“Suffer little children, and forbid them not, to come unto me: for of such is the kingdom of heaven.”

It can also be found in Luke 18:16. This concept, the Kingdom of God being likened to little children, must have been very important for it to be stated three times in three different Gospels. We know, of course, that we have simple child-like faith to enter the Kingdom of God.

“Jesus called a little child unto him, and set him in the midst of them, And said, Verily I say unto you, Except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, the same is greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoso shall receive one such little child in my name receiveth me.” (Matthew 18:1-5)

If, Jesus, is quoted in three different Gospels as saying the Kingdom of God is like little children, and in receiving this little child in His name, is the same as receiving Him, it then makes sense that our adversary is out to destroy the Kingdom of God, to destroy children, using one of his chief means, abortion. 1Peter 5:8 :

“...your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:...”
